# What benefits am I eligible for?



#### Regular employee

Regular employees are hired for an indefinite duration.



### Student employee

Students are classified as post doc, graduate, undergraduate, or high school and are hired for a definite duration.

While high school students are not eligible for any benefits, all other students are eligible for benefits based on pay status.



### Term employee

Term appointment employees are hired for a definite duration to meet a short-term or project related need.

## What is your pay status?

Regardless of position type, benefits eligibility is largely based on your pay status.



### Full-time and Part-time, Regular, Student, Term

Full-time employees work 80 hours every pay period and are eligible for a comprehensive benefits package.

Part-time employees must work at least 50% time or a minimum average of 20 hours per week in a consecutive 12-month period to be eligible and to remain eligible for benefits.



### **Casual Student**

Casual employees work no more than 40% of full-time hours (832) in a consecutive 12-month period. Only Casual Students in a post doc, graduate, or undergraduate position are eligible for benefits.

Casual employees must work a minimum average of 20 hours per week in a consecutive 12-month period to remain eligible for a select benefits package.

\*Casual Regular, Term and high school students are eligible for paid sick leave, but not
